

CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of Study

Indonesia is a country with blended cultures, coming from different ethnics, races and languages. 1.2 Problem formulation.

2. Is there any relationship between the motivational standards and the scores of second semester students?

1.3 Scope and Limitation

The scopes of the study are motivation standards in grammar class and the relationship between students' motivation and students' scores. And the study is limited to the second semester students of English Department, Bina Nusantara University only.

1.4 Goals and Functions

1.5 Research Methodology

A. Library research
