## CHAPTER V CONCLUSIONS

## **5.1 Conclusions**

Based on the analysis in chapter four, it can be concluded that hybridity found in the movie are religion hybridity and cultural hybridity

Religion hybridity is found on where the setting takes place, in a western cathedral, but the occupants and the students were Chinese. Proving that Catholicism is accepted in China.

Cultural hybridity can be seen in several scenes of the movie, such as fashion and customs were seen in the movie. Notably, the coats where the comfort women wore when they came to the church were the design of that western coats. For the customs aspect, when Miller flirt Yu Mo by copying her ways of drinking liquors, the way Yu Mo drinks is typical among Asian cultures, by drinking liquor via a cup or bowl.
